

# Pupil Premium Grant Expenditure: 2017-2018

### Principles

- We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all of the pupils
- We ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups this includes ensuring the needs of socially disadvantaged pupils are adequately assessed and addressed.
- We recognise that not all pupils who receive free school meals will be socially disadvantaged.
- We also recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are registered or qualify for free school meals. We reserve the right to allocate the Pupil Premium funding
- To support any pupil or groups of pupils the school has legitimately identified as being socially disadvantaged.
- Pupil Premium funding will be allocated following a needs analysis which will identify priority classes, groups or individuals. Limited funding and resources means that not all children receiving free school meals will be in receipt of pupil premium interventions at one time.

Money to support children so all can be fully involved in the annual residential visit-----£2110  
New maths scheme and training and development for NFER-----£500  
Subscription for R4L so that we can access a range of materials particularly books for those with high interest low ability-----£1318  
Purchase of Word Blaze spelling intervention-----£220

### Outcomes to date:

Children who need support for a range of emotional difficulties have access to a trained ELSA. Children are more articulate in how they feel, why they feel that way and what support they can have access to.

Access for all children to the annual residential which builds resilience, self-esteem, team building independence, determination and many more of our whole school values.

Disadvantaged children perform above the national average.

As a school we are working at more children achieving greater depth in the basics.

The new maths scheme is working well in KS1 and its clarity is impacting on those who are disadvantaged as they can access it more easily. (this scheme is new and the year 3/4 books will be out in the spring and the year 5/6 books will be out in September 2018)

Children with low ability but high interest in reading are making good progress in maths

The new spelling intervention will be used in January 2018 and therefore as yet we have no impact to report.
